


Breaking Gender Barriers

of their own. Tonight

at the New York Center for Independent Publishing, that organization, the **Women's National Book Association**, celebrates its 90th anniversary and the launch of **National Reading Group Month** with a **read-a-thon** featuring authors Laura Dave (*London is the Best City in America*), Wally Lamb (*She's Come Undone*), Matthew Sharpe (*Jamestown*), Beverly Swerling (*City of Dreams*), and Adriana Trigiani (*Big Stone Gap*). Congratulations, WNBA, and here's to another 90 years of supporting the (gender bias-free) community of the book.

Ironically, it looks like the WNBA has outlived its sexist predecessor; a scan of the **New York Times archives** tells me members spent a lot of time talking shop at "smokers". Perhaps the old fellows puffed themselves to death!
